

New Jersey Civic Information Consortium announces host sites for NJ Documents program, in collaboration with City Bureau

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The <u>New Jersey Civic Information Consortium</u>, in collaboration with <u>City Bureau</u>, is excited to <u>announce</u> the two organizations selected as the inaugural host sites for the <u>NJ Documenters</u> program, an innovative initiative that will train and pay community members to attend and document public meetings and publish the results.

The two organizations, <u>coLAB Arts</u> in New Brunswick, N.J., and the <u>NJ Alliance for Immigrant Justice</u> in Newark, N.J., will be responsible for overseeing the operations of their respective programs. This includes recruiting and training Documenters, scheduling their assignments, and providing them with the necessary resources and support. Additionally, they will be responsible for promoting and raising awareness about the NJ Documenters program within their communities.

By fulfilling these responsibilities, the host sites will contribute to the overall goal of promoting civic engagement, transparency, and informed decision-making in New Jersey.

coLAB Arts, based in New Brunswick, is known for its commitment to community engagement through various artistic and civic initiatives. Their involvement in the NJ Documenters program will contribute to fostering a culture of informed and active communities in New Jersey.

<u>The NJ Alliance for Immigrant Justice</u>, situated in Newark, has a strong track record of advocating for immigrant rights and social justice. By hosting the NJ Documenters initiative, they will play a pivotal role in amplifying community voices and ensuring diverse perspectives are represented in local news coverage.

"Public meetings are workshops of democracy, where residents of every American community can witness, learn about, and act on the systems that impact their lives," said Max Resnik, City Bureau's Director of Network Services. "Documenters.org is a tool designed to help residents access the information they need to get civically involved and have their voices heard."



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The Consortium is currently engaged in establishing a third host site, which will be announced in the coming months, further expanding the reach and impact of the NJ Documenters initiative.
